Message from Pastor Gary

Dear Friends,

My sermon title for January 29th was "Standing in the Storm" using Matthew 14:22-33 as my text. Little did I realize that on January 25th my family would enter a storm unlike any we had experienced before. Lunette had been feeling poorly for several days, we had gone to our doctor on the 23rd and were waiting to hear from lab work that had been done when she began to feel so bad that we could not wait any longer. We arrived at Chatham Hospital around 3:30 that afternoon and, according to the doctors, we had arrived none too soon. They would airlift her to UNC Hillsborough and place her in the ICU and vigorously begin to treat the C Diff infection that almost took her life.

While all of this was happening, I heard of Cheryl Boisvert losing her grandfather and two other young men in our community passing away at such young ages. What storms! More than once, I thought of the message I was going to share about Christ "standing in the storms" of life. When you are facing such a storm, with more questions than answers and no assurance of exactly what the outcome of the storm is going to be, you are then most grateful that God stands with you in

those storms. I discovered that God's presence in the storm is the most important thing! When God stands with you, you are not alone!

I am so grateful for the outcome we currently are experiencing. Lunette is out of the hospital and, at the time of me writing this article, still weak but getting stronger. Thank you for the prayers that you offered and the many ways you blessed us with your love and support. God used all of that to sustain us through this storm! We are grateful. We thank God for using the expertise that He has made available to the mind of man and the way the doctors used their skill and talents to help Lunette recover from a scarv situation.

In closing, we all know that one day we all must face the storm of death if the Good Lord tarries. I am more convinced that even when we face that final storm of this earthly life, we who love Him and have trusted Him as our Lord and as our Savior, we see him standing in the storm to see us through! Blessed be His holy name!
