Hurricane Laura's destructive winds, reaching 140 mph, wreaked havoc on Alexandria, Louisiana's houses of worship. Among them, 107 Baptist churches suffered varying degrees of damage, and some may not be able to reopen. The Louisiana Baptist state missions staff worked tirelessly to evaluate the extent of the destruction and assist affected pastors and churches. Disturbingly, 43 Baptist pastors not only faced damage to their

churches but also endured damage to their homes, with about 10 possibly being completely destroyed. Recovery efforts are being supported by state convention, national, and local church partners, as the Louisiana Baptists express gratitude. The impact of Hurricane Laura remains deeply felt in Louisiana, demanding ongoing recovery endeavors for months ahead. Please pray for recovery efforts in Louisiana and the work Baptist Men are doing.

According to the article, surveys indicate that less than 2% of Utah's population and 11% in Idaho are evangelical Christians. Baptists are only 0.6% of Utah's population and 1.4% in Idaho. Although the percentages would be quite different here, the premise is no less true. Let us be vigilant to take advantage of every opportunity - with
