Message from Pastor Blume

Facing the Challenges of 2024

Another year is in the record books. It cannot be re-lived or changed. A new year is unfolding minute by minute. We have an opportunity to make the most of it or to become victims of indifference. We can live as people of faith or people of unbelief.

Chapter 9 of Mark's gospel records the story of a man whose son was possessed by an evil spirit. The father took his son to Jesus' disciples, but the disciples were powerless to heal the boy. The father was frustrated. The disciples were frustrated. Even Jesus expressed grief over the failure of His disciples. Verse 28 says, "When He came into the house, His disciples began questioning Him privately, 'Why could we not drive it out?" Verse 29 records Jesus' reply to them, "This kind cannot come out by anything but prayer."

There are times when we feel helpless and frustrated over challenges we face. We feel spiritually powerless and helpless. Situations like this teach us the importance of prayer. Jesus is telling us that prayer is the ONLY way to get answers from God. He is not talking about tacking a prayer on a worship service, committee meeting or Bible study group. He is saying our faith must be strong and

completely devoted to God's purpose in such a way that we are driven to pray desperately, regularly and faithfully.

Are you praying desperately about the matters that trouble you? Do you really believe God can resolve the issues? Complaining will not bring answers from God. Prayer will. Blaming someone never resolves the issues. Prayer will. Remember, God's word tells us that He is "able to do far more abundantly beyond all that we ask or think, according to the power that works within us..." Ephesians 3:20 (NASB)


Music Ministry Opportunities
