#### Message from Pastor Blume

Easter: The Season to Return

Easter is Christianity's oldest and most important holiday. It is a season when Christians emphasize and celebrate the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the grave. He was crucified on Friday and defeated death, the mortal enemy of mankind, by coming out of his borrowed tomb on Sunday. He is alive!

Research shows that more people search for the word "church" online during the Easter season than any other time of the year. Christmas comes in second. We also know that more lost, non-Christians attend church around Christmas, whereas those who are looking for a church during the Easter season are "returning Christians."

In other words, these are people who previously participated in church and are likely still on a church roll somewhere. But they are looking for a chance to reconnect with a church family. They are searching for the values they saw in a local church when they were growing up, but for some reason they dropped out of church. Some

of these people have been hurt and disillusioned by churches in conflict that lost their mission and purpose. Some just got sidetracked by secular priorities and have discovered the emptiness it delivers.

Will some of these "returning Christians" walk through the doors of Flat Springs Baptist Church this month? If they do, what will they find? Will they find people whose Christian faith is real or people who are just going through the motions of religion? Will they find an acceptance that prompts them to return? Will they see believers who enjoy worshiping Jesus? These are honest questions we cannot overlook. These are people we must not ignore.

I hope you will invite unchurched people of every kind to worship with us at Easter. I hope they see Jesus and find what they need to fill the emptiness of their heart and soul.

I'm praying for you. Thank you for praying for me!



#### Who was Annie Walker Armstrong?

Annie was born 1850 in Baltimore at a time when there was little opportunity for women. Yet, her devotion to Christ led her to a life of service and leadership. She organized women to pray, to give and to meet the needs around them. She challenged pastors and churches to action and rallied vital support for missionaries until her passing in 1938. Ultimately, Annie was recognized as a national Southern Baptist trailblazer for her visionary leadership that still inspires millions today.





#### **Armstrong's Contributions**

- ♥ Started Bay View Mission for Baltimore's poor and addicted
- ▼ Served as the first executive of Woman's Missionary
- ▼ Led the formation of missions' organizations for chil-
- Raised support for missionaries to Italian and Jewish immigrants
- ▼ Refused a salary because she would never give to the Lord "that which costs me nothing," inspired by 2 Samuel 24:24
- Initiated fund-raising "brick cards" to build churches

- ♥ Gained support for the first black, female missionar-
- Secured funds to relieve China missionary, Lottie Moon, who had served for 11 years without a furlough
- ▼ Advocated for Native Americans and impoverished mountain people
- ♥ Honored in 1934 when *The Home Missions Offering* was re-named for her to encourage more to follow her sacrificial example. We know this as The Annie Armstrong Missions Offering.
