Broken and Spilled Out

Matthew 26:26-29 (ESV)

Introduction: What a contrast between two Sundays; last Sunday we were singing the carols of the coming of the Messiah and today we will come to the table of the ultimate reason Christ came. Christmas is nothing without Easter. Bethlehem is still insignificant without a hill called Mount Calvary. The infant in the straw is destined to become the Servant on the Cross. Today, as “joy to the world, the Lord is come” still echoes in our left ear, may we hear the dark melody of “broken and spilled out” in our right ear.

- I. A Prayer
 - a. A blessing before the bread.
 - b. Jesus gave thanks before the cup.
- II. A Purpose
 - a. Luke 22:19 quotes Jesus as saying about the bread “this is my body, which is given for you.
 - b. Our text says in verse 28 of the cup, this is poured out for forgiveness of sins.
- III. A Promise
 - a. Jesus looks backward at the Passover and says this is my last.
 - b. He looks forward to the fulfillment of his sacrifice in the eternal kingdom of God.

Conclusion: Today, before we come to the table, with Christmas still fresh on our minds, may we be grateful for the Christ of Christmas who was broken and spilled out for us! Bethlehem is not far from Calvary!
