When Change is Not Wanted

John 3:1-15 (ESV)

Introduction: Today, we look at a passage that will make us realize we need to change but really don't always want to change. Nicodemus can be a wonderful mirror to see ourselves and ask ourselves some important questions about change in our lives.

- I. CULTURE: Cultural concerns can make change unwanted.
a. Nicodemus came by night.
b. Jesus has just cleared the temple in the previous chapter.
II. CONVINCED: Preconceived ideas about things can make change unwanted.
a. Nicodemus wanted to think of Christ words with his own understanding.
b. There is a different opinion on about everything.
III. CONNECTED: Connecting the Spiritual with the Physical is necessary for change.
a. Jesus says that change in the inner man is as drastic as birth!
b. To be born again is a complete change. This is what God requires.

Conclusion: Is the culture making some changes we ought to make hard? Have we convinced ourselves that some things God commands are no longer commands? Have we connected that what we think and how we live must be connected?
